TIMBERTON EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS PROGRAM

Self Help. All Timberton residents should have a plan in place to be able to help themselves in the event of a natural disaster such as an earthquake, a tsunami, a severe windstorm, or a wildfire. This plan should include a basic emergency supply kit organized and easily accessible. Based on estimates of the time it may take for communications to be restored, bridges and roads to be reopened, and emergency responders to reach us, each resident should have the following:

*Water: one gallon per person per day for drinking and sanitation for up to 14 days.

*Food: non-perishable food supplies for up to 14 days. See also www.ready.gov.

*Medical Supplies: critical medications, special needs items such as hearing aids and batteries, eyeglasses or contact lenses, dentures, wheelchairs, walkers, etc. First Aid Kit containing alcohol wipes, sterile bandages and gauze dressings, N95 disposable face-masks, scissors, tweezers, antibiotic ointment, cold compress, thermometer, etc.

*Practical Supplies: flashlights (extra batteries or crank-type), NOAA weather radio (solar powered or crank-type), knife, axe/hatchet, tarp, matches in waterproof container, rope, can-opener (non-electric), eating and drinking utensils, cookware, gloves, bleach, etc.

*Other Items: cash and change, (ATMs and credit cards may not be usable), personal hygiene items, large supply of toilet paper, paper towels, hand sanitizer, season-specific clothing (coats, gloves, hats, socks) and sturdy shoes/boots. Don't forget Pet food and supplies.

Emergency Preparedness Team. Timberton has a team to communicate with South Bay and North Bay com centers, the Fire Department, and Jefferson County's Emergency Response officials in such an event. Our purpose is to <u>OBSERVE</u> the situation, <u>VERIFY</u> the extent of any damage to people or property, <u>REPORT</u> needs to the appropriate officials, and <u>ASSIST</u> our neighbors as best we can. We have seven members on our team, one on each street or area in Timberton. Each of us is equipped with a two-way radio, and we participate in drills several times a year to practice using them. In an emergency situation, we will communicate special needs through the South Bay Com Center to first responders. We will also mark hazards such as propane tanks, help with tasks like opening a garage door when the electricity is out, shutting off water mains, etc.
